There was a press conference held in downtown Toronto for the continental African Housing solution, a project to help create affordable housing for African Canadians. There were community leaders, politicians and housing representatives to collaborate on finding the project and how to move it further to support the African communities. GCAO is a partner in this initiative to create Affordable housing incorporate into our heritage Centre project.

The initiative's focus on the affordable housing model centered on traditional African values of community, family and culture is being highlighted by the Ghanaian Canadian Association of Ontario in partnership with the Rwandan Canadian Healing Center (RCHC) and other African partners.

The program is called the African Canadian Affordable Housing – Solutions Lab Project. This is to help Africans living in Canada to access affordable housing looking at the traditional African village for African descent who have not been able to experience it.

YOUTH WING UPDATES

Developing programs and support with meaningful positive engagement for youth has many benefits. The Youth planning group that focuses on youth ages 18-24 held various activities throughout the year to address key issues faced by youth such as:

Exam De-Stress Fest

Recognizing that exam season was rapidly approaching for post-secondary students and acknowledging that the pressure to perform well in these exams was overwhelming and can affect mental health, they created a safe space for young people to decompress, relax, and communicate with others experiencing similar circumstances. Individuals were able to converse with their peers about exam season success strategies or simply rest if they so desired.

Sankofa Mmomudwan

This program was hosted on Instagram live where they highlighted Ghanaians in the community and had a live and brief chat about what they do and why they do what they do. The IG series was called "Sankofa Mmomudwan." Sankofa Mmomudwan is a two-part meaning [1] 'go back and get' using the past to build the future and [2] unity and togetherness. The aim of this series is to go back to our roots collectively and come together as a united community in the diaspora.

Excellence in the Community

During the Black History Month, we invited youth and young people to keep reflecting on what comes next and whether recognizing the work of and amplifying the voices of our compatriots in the diaspora and the Black community at large stops after Black History Month finishes or if it should be celebrated beyond that. We want to amplify the voices of those in our community and celebrate achievement wherever possible.

Jump Start Your Journey

The aim of this program was to equip youth and young people with the skills and tools necessary to jumpstart their financial journeys now, rather than later and ultimately pave the way for them to understand what it takes to be financially literate in this time.

GCAO LAUNCHES MEN'S WING GROUP

CAO Men's Wing was launched on March 25, 2023, with the following objective and focus areas in mind.

Objective: To create a safe space where all Ghanaian and Non-Ghanaian men of all ages and generations can come together to discuss, learn, teach, mentor each other, and build community.

Focus Areas:

Mental Health and Complete Well-being: This will be achieved through regular programs via workshops from experts in the field of Mental Health, Therapy, Psychology, etc. Debunk myths and cultural practices around mental health, emotional vulnerability, and physical exercise. Furthermore, we will aim to create a resource hub where interested persons can access help at any time.

Financial Education (Investment, Life Insurance, Estate Planning, Taxes, Educational Funds, Business Tips): We hope to achieve this by bringing in Financial educators and creating a network of Ghanaian Canadian professionals to share their experiences and relate the information to a more cultural context for maximum grasp.

Passing Down Culture and Tradition to the Younger Generation: We hope to facilitate conversations that will uncover the reasons behind the disconnect between the older and younger generation. We hope to build a stronger bond through these conversations so that culture and tradition can be passed down and keep our Ghanaian languages, traditions, culture, and many more vibrant and alive.

Marriage & Relationships: We will explore how we can continue to build good marriages and relationships and find better ways to mitigate some of the challenges. We hope to frequently have joint sessions with the Women Wing to understand each other's perspective and work on a solution together.

Proactively stem gender violence: Educate men on the signs of gender violence and proactively address them.

We also provide support in the following areas: Translation/interpretation services and help with preparing government and other official applications. Our team is fluent in various Ghanaian languages including Twi, Fante, Ga, Hausa, Ewe, Dangbe. Information/referral services, including supportive, advocacy services /guardians.

Homework/After-School Programs

The Homework Club, one of GCAO's first programs, is an after-school program that is designed to provide elementary to high school students (aged 6 years to 18 years) support in completing their homework as well as developing other skills. The program is run by registered teachers, as well as retired teachers and community members who have experience working with children and youth.

Ghanaian-Canadian Chamber of Commerce


